Stephanie Hamelin Tomala is a canadian composer, violinist, pianist and singer with Ecuadorian and lebanese roots. In 2019, she won 2 first prizes for her music score composed for the american film Final Curtain, directed by Jonathan Chiarle; one from the SOCAN Foundation and the other from the Burbank International Film Festival. She was nominated in the contemporary/classical instrumental composition category for her orchestral piece Ceremonial Tribute to Krakow at the 2021 ceremony awards of the Hollywood Music in Media Awards. She recently created the music of the Comic Stric Chronicles series and the documentary Sometimes I wish I was on a Desert Island, films produced by the National Film Board of Canada.
